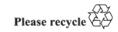

Please provide information on the steps envisaged to incorporate the rights enshrined in the Covenant in domestic law, including an update on the draft human rights strategy of action for the period 2019–2021 mentioned in paragraph 47 of the State party report and information on whether an open, inclusive and effective public consultation will take place in the drafting process. Please also provide information on the cases in which Covenant rights have been invoked before or applied by domestic courts, if any, including the number of such cases and examples. Please provide information on the measures taken to ensure the independence of the judiciary and the separation of its powers from the legislature and the executive.
- 2. Please provide information on the legislative framework regarding the registration of independent self-initiated civil society groups. Please provide information on the steps taken to ensure participation and consultation in the drafting of the code on non-governmental non-commercial organizations. - (a) The proportion of persons below the poverty line, and the levels of inequality, defined as the ratio between the total income accruing to the richest decile of the population and the total income of the poorest 40 per cent of the population;
 - (b) The proportion of public revenue that is generated through taxes;
- (c) The tax rates levied on corporate profits and on personal income, the value added tax rate (exclusive of the value added tax on luxury items, tobacco, alcohol, sugary drinks and snacks, and fuel), and the percentage of total revenue that is generated from personal income taxes collected from the richest decile of the population;
- (d) Public expenditure as a percentage of gross domestic product and, within total public expenditure, the proportion of the public budget that is allocated to social spending (social security, food, water and sanitation, housing, health and education);
 - (e) Inflation-adjusted absolute levels of social spending.

Non-discrimination (art. 2 (2))

Right to work (art. 6)

Please clarify whether legislative amendments are foreseen to criminalize various forms of forced labour, including the worst forms of child labour, and what other measures are being taken to counter such practices and to provide support to victims.

Right to just and favourable conditions of work (art. 7)

10. Please provide information on the measures taken to ensure effective compliance with the principle of equal pay for work of equal value. Please provide information on the minimum wage, its applicability to all workers regardless of the type of contract, including in the informal economy, and enforcement mechanisms and their effectiveness. Please

provide information on the steps taken or envisaged to regularly review and adjust the level of the minimum wage to ensure a decent living for workers and their families.

Trade union rights (art. 8)

- 11. With reference to paragraph 106 of the State party report, please provide an update on the new version of the Trade Unions Act and its conformity with the Covenant. Please clarify whether the draft code on non-governmental non-commercial organizations has been brought into line with article 8 of the Covenant by eliminating administrative barriers. Please provide further information on how the draft law on the organization and holding of meetings, rallies, demonstrations and other mass events fully allows for the exercise of the right to strike and please indicate any restrictions on the right to strike in the public and private sectors and their justification.
- 12. Please provide updated data on the number of trade unions and their members, disaggregated by sex and ethnic group, in both the public and the private sector in the past five years, including the numbers and percentages of employees belonging and not belonging to trade unions.

Right to social security (art. 9)

13. Please provide information on the measures taken to develop a national social security strategy and government policies to establish social security programmes to cover all persons in vulnerable situations. Please provide information on the specific steps taken to extend social security coverage, in particular to children, older persons and persons with disabilities.

Protection of the family and children (art. 10)

14. With reference to paragraph 128 of the State party report, please provide information on the impact of the measures taken to prevent violence against children in the Mehribonlik homes and other children's institutions. Please indicate what measures have been taken to ensure the enjoyment of the rights contained in the Covenant by Roma/Lyuli children.

Right to an adequate standard of living (art. 11)

- 15. In the light of the Committee's previous recommendation (E/C.12/UZB/CO/2, para. 21), please provide information on the measures taken or envisaged to address land ownership, in particular regarding women's access to land ownership, to ensure access to justice in the case of land deprivation, prosecution of the perpetrators and redress for the victims. Please also provide statistical data on the prevalence of hepatitis C and tuberculosis in the State party and measures of prevention.

Please indicate the major challenges related to sexual and reproductive health and provide information on the implementation of the Reproductive Health Act 2019 mentioned in paragraph 157 of the State party report and on its impact in terms of ensuring access to sexual and reproductive health services, including emergency contraception. Please provide information on sexual and reproductive health education, services and counselling provided to the public in general and to adolescents in particular. Please provide information on the efforts taken to reduce both maternal and infant mortality. Please also provide information on the most marginalized groups, in particular Roma/Lyuli.
