It had held meetings on maternal mortality and morbidity with the United Nations Programme on the Family and the Centre for Reproductive Rights, to lay the foundation for a general comment on sexual and reproductive rights; on the environment, climate change and human rights, with the Friedrich Ebert Foundation; and on indicators of economic, social and cultural rights and harmonization with other treaty bodies, with the independent expert on the question of human rights and extreme poverty and the Director of the Human Rights Treaties Division of the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights.
