Mr. MILJETEIG-OLSEN (UNICEF) reassured the members that there was little reason to fear overlap between the Committee's work and that of UNICEF concerning the reports from States parties. UNICEF would, when requested, assist government officials in preparing the reports according to the guidelines, but would leave it to the Committee and the Technical Advisory Services to give advice on the legal interpretation of the various articles and on other legal aspects related to reporting.
