<u>Draft conclusions and recommendations of the Committee</u> (CAT/C/XXIII/Concl.7) (Distributed in the conference room in French only)

1. <u>At the invitation of the Chairman, Mr. Vahidov (Uzbekistan) took a place at the Committee table</u>.

2. <u>Mr. CAMARA</u> (Country Rapporteur) read out the Committee's conclusions and recommendations on the initial report of Uzbekistan.

3. <u>Mr. VAHIDOV</u> (Uzbekistan), thanking the Committee, said that its recommendations would play a crucial role in the further development of Uzbekistan's evolving human rights legislation. His delegation looked forward to continuing an active dialogue with the Committee and would communicate any information requested. Every effort would be made to ensure that the report due in October 2000 fully reflected the Committee's recommendations particularly with regard to changes in legislation.
