Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. The thirty-sixth session of the Committee against Torture will be held at the United Nations Office at Geneva (Palais Wilson) from 6 to 24 November 2006. The first meeting of the session will be convened on Monday, 6 November 2006 at 10.30 a.m.
- 2. In accordance with rule 6 of the rules of procedure, the Secretary-General has prepared, in consultation with the Chairman of the Committee, the attached provisional agenda for the session. Annotations to the provisional agenda are also attached.
