Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. The thirty- ninth session of the Committee against Torture will be held at the United Nations Office at Geneva (Palais Wilson) from 5 23 November 2007. The first meeting of the session will be convened on Monday, 5 November, at 10.30 a.m.
