HUMAN RIGHTS COMMITTEE Sixty-third session Geneva 13-31 July 1998

PROVISIONAL AGENDA AND ANNOTATIONS

Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. The sixty-third session of the Human Rights Committee will be held at the United Nations Office at Geneva from 13 to 31 July 1998. The first meeting will be convened on Monday, 13 July 1998 at 10.30 a.m.
- 2. In accordance with rule 6 of the Committee's rules of procedure, the Secretary-General has prepared, in consultation with the Chairperson of the Committee, the attached provisional agenda for the sixty-third session. Annotations to the provisional agenda are also attached.
- 3. Pursuant to rule 33 of the Committee's rules of procedure the meetings of the Committee will be held in public unless the Committee decides otherwise or it appears from the relevant provisions of the Covenant or the Optional Protocol that the meetings should be held in private.
- 4. The attention of States parties is drawn, in particular, to the annotations to item 5 which contain the tentative timetable for the consideration of reports at the sixty-third session. In accordance with rule 68 of the Committee's rules of procedure, representatives of States parties may be present at the meetings of the Committee when their reports are examined.
- 5. At its sixty-second session, the Committee decided that a working group, established under rules 62 and 89 of its rules of procedure, should meet for a period of one week prior to its sixty-third session. The working group is scheduled to meet at the United Nations Office in Geneva from 6 to 10 July 1998.

ANNOTATIONS

1. Adoption of the agenda

Under rule 8 of the Committee's rules of procedure, the first item on the provisional agenda for any session shall be the adoption of the agenda. In accordance with rule 9, during a session, the Committee may revise the agenda and may, as appropriate, defer or delete items; only urgent and important items may be added to the agenda.

2. <u>Organizational and other matters</u>

Under this item, the Committee will consider its programme of work for the session. In this connection, it may be noted that the Committee decided at its sixty-second session that the pre-sessional working group would deal not only with communications under the Optional Protocol, but would also address issues under article 40 of the Covenant, prepare concise lists of issues concerning reports scheduled for consideration at the sixty-third session, consider any draft general comment that may be put before it, and continue its discussion of methods of work with a view to adopting new guidelines on the examination of State party reports, consider ways of overcoming the backlog of State party reports and of communications awaiting examination, and explore ways of obtaining strengthened secretariat support, including through the adoption of a plan of action. Moreover, the Committee will continue its discussion of issues addressed to it by the Commission on Human Rights, including the question of minimum humanitarian standards, pursuant to resolution 1998/20 of the Commission on Human Rights, and the question of a draft optional protocol to the Convention against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment, under Commission resolution 1998/34. The Committee will also examine the International Law Commission's Preliminary Conclusions on reservations to normative multilateral treaties excluding human rights treaties.

In accordance with rule 68 of the Committee's rules of procedure, the Secretary-General has informed the States parties concerned of the tentative dates on which their respective reports are scheduled for consideration by the Committee at its sixty-third session.

5. General comments of the Committee

Under this item, the Committee will consider any draft general comment that may be put before it by its pre-sessional working group on article 40.

6. <u>Consideration of communications under the Optional Protocol to the Covenant</u>

In accordance with the provisions of chapter XVII of the rules of procedure, the Committee will consider under this item communications which are or appear to be submitted to it under the Optional Protocol.

One hundred and sixty-six communications are pending before the Committee from earlier sessions. Forty of these communications have already been declared admissible and are pending for a decision on the merits, i.e. Views under article 5 (4) of the Optional Protocol. Pursuant to the Committee's new rules of procedure allowing the joint examination of admissibility and merits in appropriate cases, the Committee's examination of the remaining 126 communications may result in the adoption of Views, or in decisions declaring the communications admissible or inadmissible. In

addition, the Committee will have before it summaries of a number of recently registered communications and summaries of new communications registered after its last session, together with an indication of any action which may have been taken by the Special Rapporteur on new communications.

In accordance with article 5, paragraph 3, of the Optional Protocol and rule 82 of the Committee's rules of procedure, this agenda item will be considered in closed meetings.

7. Follow-up on Views adopted pursuant to article 5, paragraph 4, of the Optional Protocol to the Covenant

Under this item, the Committee will assess the status of follow-up activities under the Optional Protocol and examine periodic reports submitted by the Special Rapporteur for the follow-up on Views.

8. <u>Future meetings of the Committee</u>

The Committee may wish to take decisions under this item on the schedule of its meetings to be held in 1999.

9. Annual report of the Committee to the General Assembly through the Economic and Social Council under article 45 of the Covenant and article 6 of the Optional Protocol

Under article 45 of the Covenant, the Committee is to submit to the General Assembly, through the Economic and Social Council, an annual report on its activities. Article 6 of the Optional Protocol provides that the Committee shall include in its annual report a summary of its Activities under the Protocol.
