In 2013, she was the Director of Consular Affairs and Services – the office that designed the procedure for assistance and protection to Ecuadorian migrants in vulnerable situations (which receives direct support from the Ecuadorian Government in the form of human and material resources) and that generated a plan under which Ecuadorian consulates and embassies would oversee the interests of Ecuadorians abroad by working with the Governments of the countries of residence.
